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Classroom measures

Rooms are organised to limit students facing each other in favour of students sitting side-by-side and facing forwards. Unnecessary furniture has been removed to maximise space. Teaching staff are encouraged to distance from students and each other and to make greater use of classroom technology such as visualizers to model work in order to reduce the time they are in face to face contact. However, it is recognised that this approach is not possible for students with complex needs. These learners' educational and care support should be provided as normal and the staff involved use face visors as well as masks and use LFD tests more frequently.

Face coverings must be worn in the classroom where 2m separation is not possible and must be worn in all communal indoor areas including the main hall and corridors. The exception to this is when students are eating or drinking in the canteen or undertaking indoor PE. Students and staff sanitise hands when entering the classrooms and when leaving classrooms.

For individual and very frequently used equipment, such as pencils and pens, staff and students should have their own items that are not shared. Classroom based resources, such as books and games, can be used and shared but should be cleaned regularly. Cleaning of rooms and resources will be conducted as required for use by students.
