Message from the Headteacher

A very warm welcome to this week's edition of Major News and Happy St David's Day! Today's Eisteddfod has been a resounding success with students and staff alike putting on excellent performances. It was wonderful to see the school community come together for this whole-school event and I extend my heartfelt thanks to all staff that were involved in the organisation and planning.

There has been a significant improvement in punctuality over the last two weeks due to the introduction of late gate. Please continue to discuss the importance of arriving to school on time with your child. We will be having individual conversations with any young person with an attendance record of lower than 90% over the coming weeks and making contact with parents/carers to discuss this. If your child has an attendance record of 90% that means they miss approximately 4 weeks of schooling over the school year, and, research shows, could achieve a grade lower at GCSE than the one which they are capable of. It would therefore be very much appreciated if you could discuss the importance of coming to school with your child/children. If children are not here they cannot engage or learn.

Unfortunately, uniform standards have slipped a little of late with more pupils wearing leggings to school. Please be reminded that leggings are not school uniform, and that if children wear them, they will either be asked to change into items from our uniform store or parents/carers will be invited to bring clothes in so their child may change.

As mentioned in a previous newsletter, we have recently finished a big piece of consultation work on feedback and will be streamlining our approach to feedback moving forward. I have been speaking with year groups in assemblies this week and will continue to do so next week to explain what they can expect. I will send a separate communication to parents on Class Charts early next week so that you too are updated.

Business Studies Department

We embarked on an educational adventure with our Year 7 pupils as they dived into a Farming Project! They combined Mathematics with real-world application by creating financial plans for the farm, exploring diverse scenarios, and improving their analytical and problem-solving skills.

In this adventure, students delved into the realm of agriculture, investigating cutting-edge farming methods and technologies. They used their creativity to bring their mathematical designs to life through a cooperative Minecraft build, transforming virtual landscapes into sustainable farms.

Finally, Abi Reader, NFU Cymru Deputy President came in to talk to Year 7 about how Maths, Science and Technology is used in farming. The pupils enjoyed seeing the relevance of these curriculum areas within a real-world context.



Year 9 Seren Workshop at Cardiff University

This week, 15 students from the Seren group chose to attend a STEM workshop at Cardiff University with a focus on engineering. A suite of engaging activities were provided by Airbus, Balfour Beatty, and Network Rail to raise aspirations with an engineering focus.

Balfour Beatty

The highlight of this workshop was exploring how technology can be used to benefit society. Spot the dog, a robotic dog that specialises in advanced 3D scanning, is used in areas of nuclear sensitivity and earthquakes and uses groundbreaking technology to complete otherwise potentially dangerous work.



Airbus

I was blown away by the knowledge of our students about aeroplanes! I shouldn't have been so surprised due to our locality to the airport, but they really did know far more about Airbus designs and manufacturing than the Airbus lecturer expected them to. Top marks for this workshop Llantwit!



Network Rail

This workshop investigated bridge making materials, construction and design. Students were challenged to work out which chocolate bar from a range of fillings - would hold the most weight before snapping whilst acting as a bridge between two poles. Calculations were made and design features were examined prior to testing their strength and weak points. Students also got to keep the chocolate!

Contacting School

Please be reminded that we operate an appointments only system for meeting with parents/carers and if you present at school requesting an immediate appointment we will not be able to accommodate you.

Forgotten Items

We can no longer accept the delivery of forgotten items such as PE kit, books, lunch boxes etc. during the school day. Please ensure your child arrives at school with the equipment needed for the day. In the exceptional case that you do need to bring an item into school for your child, you will be asked to leave it on the desk in the main entrance. This is to reduce traffic on to the school site and ensure student safety during lesson transitions.

Medication

Please note we **do not** stock medication of any kind in school, including paracetamol, and we are not allowed to dispense medication without parental consent. If your child receives prescribed medication a medical form, available from main Reception to be collected by your son/daughter, will be required to be completed and returned to Reception. Should your child need medication throughout the school day please ensure they bring just what is needed for the day to school with them.
