Message from the Headteacher

Welcome to the first December edition of Major News.

As the weather gets colder, please ensure your child/children are leaving for school in an appropriately warm, waterproof coat. As per previous communications, pupils may wear all back socks over tights and coats are permitted as pupils walk about the school building but must be removed in classrooms, which are appropriately heated. A few pupils have presented to school in leggings this week due to the cold weather. Appropriate trousers and/or a skirt with thick tights are considerably warmer attire than leggings, so please be reminded that leggings are not permitted. All black footwear is also required, please.

Unfortunately, there have been a few quite serious incidents on the bus in the last few weeks which have involved pupils who are not entitled to travel on certain routes attempting to do so and refusing to disembark. In both cases, the other pupils on the bus have needed to disembark in order for the situation to be resolved by senior staff, and this week, another bus needed to be sent to transport those pupils who were entitled to travel home safely. I can only apologise for this disruption and assure you that the pupils in question have been sanctioned appropriately and issued with bus bans. As I'm sure you can appreciate, ensuring the health and safety of all my pupils is my utmost priority. Our buses are full and if pupils who do not have passes are allowed to travel then there are not enough seats for those who are entitled to a seat, which I'm sure you will agree is unfair. Please be advised that all decisions regarding bus passes/allocation of routes are made by the Local Authority, so if you have any queries and/or your child has lost their bus pass then please make contact with them.

Christmas is nearly upon us and it is a busy time for us all here at Llantwit Major School. Our second Parent Forum meeting of the term takes place next Monday at 6pm and a warm invitation is extended to you all. 

ParentPay

We continue to move towards a 'cash-less' school. All trips and items for purchase will now be set up via ParentPay, allowing you to pay online without the need to send money into us.

Please use the ParentPay system to make any required payments, and avoid sending in cash payments into the school. If you have not already set up a ParentPay account, please contact us and we will be happy to send you the relevant link and details to put this in place.

Using ParentPay not only allows you to make payments, it provides a list of all the payments you have made and provides details of any balances due and when they are required.

As you know ParentPay is also used by our pupils to pay for their school meal. Please remember to check your child's balance regularly to ensure they have sufficient funds available to purchase their meal. For those pupils who do go 'overdrawn' letters will now be sent to parents/careers to advise them of any negative balances. Further details to follow.



Contacting School

Please refrain from telephoning the school, other than for urgent purposes. For all general enquiries please email llantwitmajorhs@valeofglamorgan.gov.uk. Please be reminded that we operate an appointments only system for meeting with parents and if you present at school requesting an immediate appointment we will not be able to accommodate you.

Forgotten Items

We can no longer accept the delivery of forgotten items such as PE kit, books, lunch boxes etc. during the school day. Please ensure your child arrives at school with the equipment needed for the day. In the exceptional case that you do need to bring an item into school for your child, you will be asked to leave it on the desk in the main entrance. This is to reduce traffic on to the school site and ensure student safety during lesson transitions.

Medication

Please note we **do not** stock medication of any kind in school, including paracetamol, and we are not allowed to dispense medication without parental consent. If your child receives prescribed medication a medical form, available from main Reception to be collected by your son/daughter, will be required to be completed and returned to Reception. Should your child need medication throughout the school day please ensure they bring just what is needed for the day to school with them.
