Welcome to the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of the academic year of Major News.

I thought it prudent to update you on meetings held with the bus company and Big Fresh, who oversee our catering, this week.

Regarding the canteen, we have been experiencing issues with wait times in the canteen, in particular 2<sup>nd</sup> sitting. The IT issues with the fobs have now largely been resolved, so things have been better this week. However, we acknowledge that there is still work to be done. It was agreed that the counter and queuing system will be re-configured so there is a hot food and cold food station. This should reduce wait times. Something else that holds the queue up is pupils joining the queue twice. This will not be permitted moving forward, pupils will only be permitted to queue once so must purchase everything they wish to on their first and only visit. Pupils pushing in and needing to be sent to the back of the queue also wastes time. In addition, pupils forgetting their fobs means it takes longer for pupils to be served so can all pupils make every effort to have them with them. This information was communicated to pupils yesterday, but I would very much appreciate your support in reiterating this message to your child/children this weekend also.

In terms of the buses, the only way in which we can ensure the correct pupils are on the correct buses is by rigorously checking bus passes. This has now started to happen. Please note that your child will only be permitted to board the bus they have been issued a pass for. If they had a pass last year but have not been issued with one this year they will not be allowed to travel. Similarly, if you have moved house and your child now needs to travel on a different route you need to contact transport in order to request a new pass. Finally, pupils are not permitted to board buses they do not have passes for in order to go to friend's houses after school. Again, please reiterate these messages to your child/children. These procedures are in place to keep everybody safe.

## **Contacting School**

The school Administration Team are experiencing a large increase in telephone calls, many of which are for nonurgent messages. Please be reminded that we operate an appointments only system for meeting with parents and if you present at school requesting an immediate appointment we will not be able to accommodate you.

## Forgotten Items

We can no longer accept the delivery of forgotten items such as PE kit, books, lunch boxes etc. during the school day. Please ensure your child arrives at school with the equipment needed for the day. In the exceptional case that you do need to bring an item into school for your child, you will be asked to leave it on the desk in the main entrance.

This is to reduce traffic on to the school site and ensure student safety during lesson transitions.

#### Medication

Please note we **do not** stock medication of any kind in school, including paracetamol, and we are not allowed to dispense medication without parental consent. If your child receives prescribed medication a medical form, available from main Reception to be collected by your son/daughter, will be required to be completed and returned to Reception.

Should your child need medication throughout the school day please ensure they bring just what is needed for the day to school with them.

# <u>Vaping</u>

Figures from the School Health Research Network show that 20% of young people from year 7 to year 11 say they've tried vaping, with 5% of secondary school pupils in Wales vaping at least once a week. We have received new advice and guidance from Public Health Wales and the Welsh Government on how to expand our smoking and behaviour policies to address the rise in vaping. We will also be revisiting our curriculum to address this growing issue.

The Minister for Education and Welsh Language, Jeremy Miles said:

"No one under 18 should be vaping. Schools are telling us this is a real issue, whether it's because of peer pressure, colourful marketing targeted at children or a lack of understanding of the potential health risks. I hope this new guidance will help pupils understand the impact of vaping so they can make the right decisions."

It is illegal in Wales and England:

• To sell vaping devices, electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes) or e-liquids containing nicotine to anyone under 18

• For adults to buy (or try to buy) vaping devices or e-cigarettes for anyone under 18. This is known as 'proxy purchase'.

Any pupil caught vaping or smoking on site will be dealt with via the school's discipline policy. We also have to keep a record for the Local Authority.

# We ask all parents to discuss vaping with their children and explain the dangers.




## **Business Studies and Careers Guidance Department**
